

About The Open University

- The OU is the largest academic institution in the UK and a world leader in flexible distance learning. Since it began in 1969, the OU has taught more than 1.5 million students.
- The OU teaches over one-third of all part-time undergraduate students at UK higher education institutions each year.
- The OU has been one of the top three UK universities for student satisfaction in the National Student Survey every year since the survey began in 2005.
- The OU's academic provision is regularly reviewed by the Quality Assurance Agency for Higher Education. The 2009 Institutional Audit resulted in judgements of confidence in the soundness of the University's management of both academic standards and quality of learning opportunities.
- 70% of students are in full-time or part-time employment, and three out of four FTSE 100 companies have sponsored staff to take OU courses.
- Nearly 20% of OU undergraduates in the UK live in the 25% most deprived areas as defined by the index of multiple deprivation.
- Over 75% of OU undergraduates and 89% of postgraduates are in employment six months after graduating (Destination of Leavers from Higher Education Survey, 2007/08, HESA).
- The OU supports a vibrant research portfolio and in the UK's latest Research Assessment Exercise (RAE 2008), the University climbed 23 places to 43rd, making the OU one of the UK's fastest rising research universities.
- In 2008, the OU was the first UK university to join iTunes U, the area
 of Apple's iTunes store offering easily downloadable educational
 content. By the end of 2009 over 13 million iTunes downloads had
 been made.
- The Open University's Teacher Education in Sub-Saharan Africa (TESSA) project won a Queen's Anniversary Prize for Higher and Further Education in 2009. Through TESSA 200,000 primary school teachers in nine countries get free access to OU materials in the classroom.
- In 2010 the OU became one of The Sunday Times' Best Places to Work in the Public Sector.
