

About The Open University

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- The OU is the largest academic institution in the UK and a world leader in flexible distance learning. Since it began in 1969, the OU has taught more than 1.7 million students.
- The OU teaches over one-third of all part-time undergraduate students at UK higher education institutions each year.
- The OU has been one of the top three UK universities for student satisfaction in the National Student Survey every year since the survey began in 2005.
- The OU's academic provision is regularly reviewed by the Quality Assurance Agency for Higher Education. The 2009 Institutional Audit resulted in judgements of confidence in the soundness of the University's management of both academic standards and quality of learning opportunities.
- Over 70% of OU students are in full-time or part-time employment, and more than four out of five FTSE 100 companies have sponsored staff to take OU courses.
- Nearly 20% of OU undergraduates in the UK live in the 25% most deprived areas.
- 27% of new OU undergraduates in 2010/11 were aged under 25.
- The OU supports a vibrant research portfolio, conducted in the UK and in international partner institutions. In the UK's last Research Assessment Exercise (RAE 2008), it climbed 23 places to rank 43rd. Its freely accessible research repository, Open Research Online (ORO), contains almost 22 thousand original research publications, nearly half of which are full text PDFs.
- The OU's research funding from UK funding councils and external grants was over £27m in 2010-11, an increase of over 20% in the 3 years since 2007-8. The University had over 1,250 Postgraduate Research Students in 2010-11; including around 370 based in its Affiliated Research Centres located around the world.
- In 2008, the OU was the first UK university to join iTunes U and has since become the first university to reach 50 million downloads of its material.
- The OU is the largest European provider of content on YouTube Edu, and the OU's OpenLearn web site is the UK's largest source of free university learning materials, with over 19 million unique visitors since 2006.
- In September 2011 the Open University's Teacher Education in Sub-Saharan Africa (TESSA) programme was awarded one of six prizes from the World Innovation Summit for Education (WISE) and commended by the judging panel for its "outstanding quality and... exceptional impact" in its work to improve the quality of teacher education in sub-Saharan Africa.
- In 2010 the OU became one of The Sunday Times' Best Places to Work in the Public Sector.
