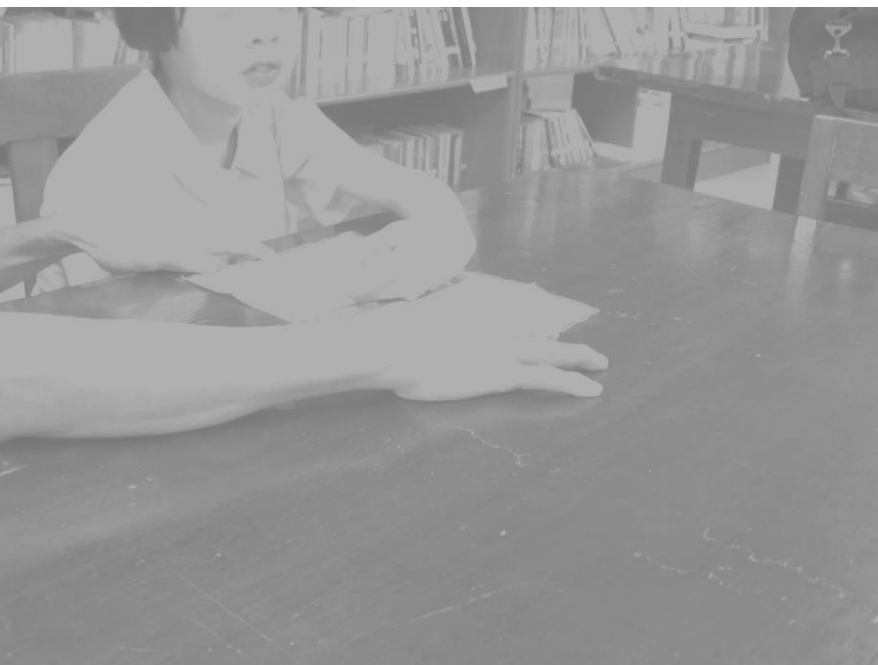

Karma

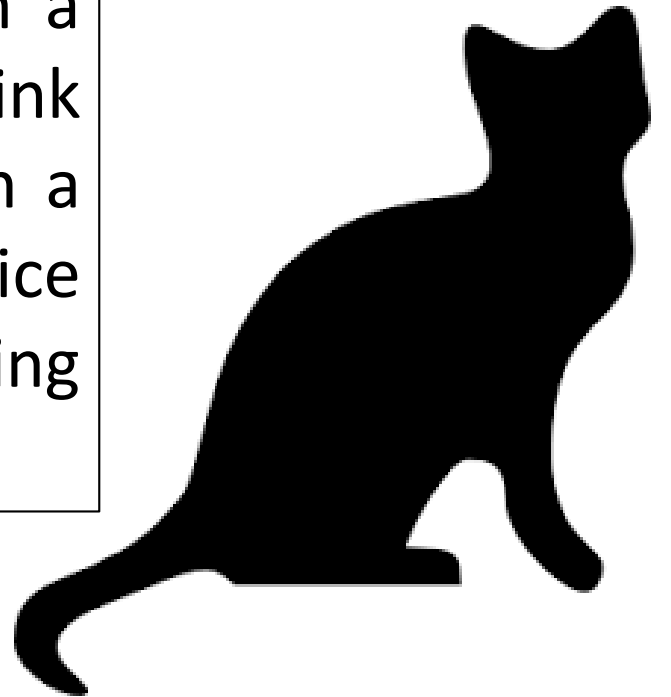
