About OpenLearn

OpenLearn is the home of free learning from The Open University. With over 15,000 hours of online courses and content available to all, absolutely free. The site attracts millions of visitors each year, giving learners the opportunity to explore a range of subjects, and build skills and confidence.

Our vision is to break down barriers to education through free educational resources, addressing access, lack of confidence, and cost.

Our content

OpenLearn is home to around [900 courses](#), and more than 8,000 articles, interactive activities, podcasts and videos covering just about everything from [space exploration](#) to [Agatha Christie](#). Collections such as the [Race & Ethnicity Hub](#) and [The Women's World Cup 2023](#) bring together topical content in one location.

All our material is created by Open University academics and subject specialists who are experts in their various fields. Content on OpenLearn includes extracts from formal Open University modules, academic research output, and bespoke items commissioned especially for OpenLearn.

Almost all content on OpenLearn is released under a [Creative Commons licence](#), meaning it can be shared, reused and adapted by educators and organisations around the world for free.

Our learners

We are really proud to reach learners who traditionally face barriers to higher education. In a recent study 14% of OpenLearn users considered themselves to have a disability; for 19% English is not their first spoken language, and 15% were unwaged and/or unable to work.¹

Each year thousands of OU students use OpenLearn to augment their formal studies, including completing their [new student induction](#), developing [study skills](#), researching their next module, or keeping their mind active between modules.

This year learners earned 357,000 free certificates and 44,000 free digital badges for completing OpenLearn courses. Hear directly from our learners in our collection [Why I study with OpenLearn](#).

On successful completion of these courses, learners will be awarded a digital badge, and a free printable Statement of Participation which provides evidence of CPD accredited learning.

Being part of the CPD Standards Office 'points' offering is important to our learners and to our students. Offering over 77 free badged courses with CPDSO accreditation status has enabled us to further contribute to professional development opportunities for everyone, with no fee required.



We know our learners love badged courses in particular as a means of recognising self-directed learning achievements and subject mastery, and with the endorsement of this national scheme, it not only provides increased visibility for OpenLearn, but another important marker for employers to recognise and feel confident in their employees' achievements.

- ▶ Making it easier to add new languages and alphabets to OpenLearn.
- ▶ Making key statistics for courses and articles more easily available.
- ▶ Improving usability in several areas of the website: ratings, mobile experience of courses and articles, and header titles.
- ▶ Changes to improve our carbon footprint such as reducing the file sizes of banner images.

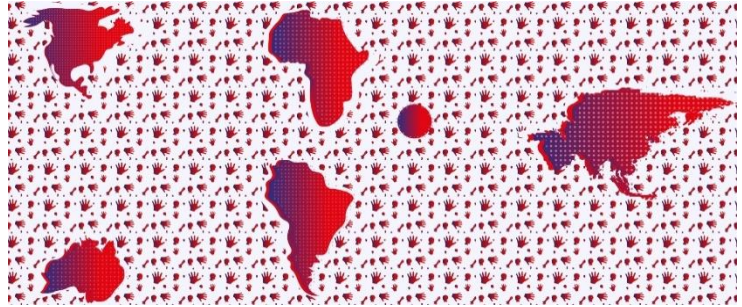

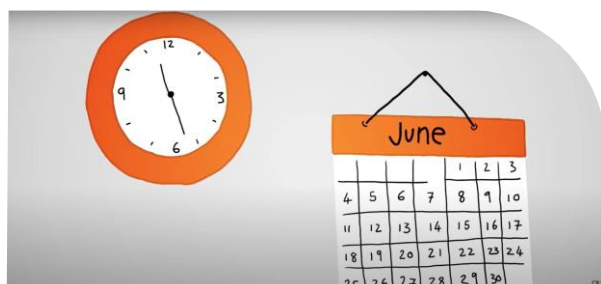
Resources for Ukrainians settling in the UK & Ireland - Winner | Open Resilience Award

This course explains how antibodies protect against viral infections and how the incidence of antibodies can be used to track an epidemic.



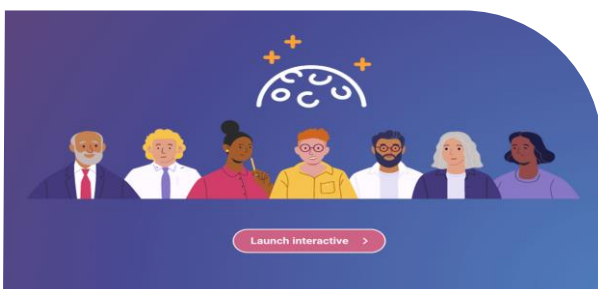
The Women's World Cup 2023 | Collection

To celebrate the biggest sporting event in the Women's Football calendar we published a selection of content offering an insight into the challenges faced by female footballers as well as articles on women in sport.



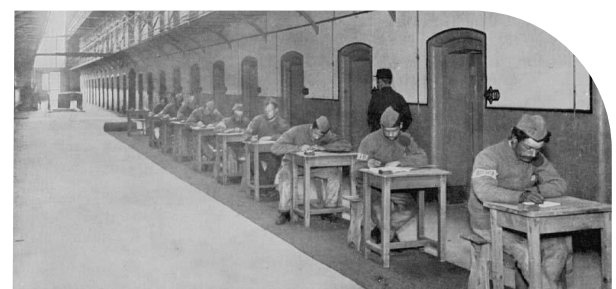
How to make the best of your digital badge | Article
