All presentations will be scheduled across the two days except the Ignite presentations which will take place on day 1.

Guidance on each session type

Poster presentations (Abstract 150 – 300 words)

Posters can be submitted for presentation as part of an hour session where conference delegates will be invited to vote for the best poster. For those in the early stages of their projects, posters should include a brief description of your project, what you're intending to do, how you are going to do it and what you're expecting to find/achieve/develop at the end of it. Alternatively, your poster can be an update on your progress so far or the outcomes of your project.

Posters will continue to be displayed throughout the conference and can be accompanied by handouts.

Short oral presentations (Abstract 250 – 500 words)

Short oral presentations are part of a chaired session which includes a number of short presentations (15 - 20 minutes). Presentations should analyse innovative work in progress and must be clearly linked to the themes of eSTEEeM. Time should also be left for discussion and questions.

Future Innovative Scholarship – Ignite presentations (Abstract 250 – 500 words)

We would like to invite proposals for a new feature of the 2020 eSTEEeM conference, Ignite-style presentations. This session is intended to stimulate the exchange of new and exciting ideas in a short time period. Ignite-style presentations will be scheduled for 60 minutes on Day 1 of the conference. These presentations will consist of between five and eight, 5-minute talks presented in the Ignite-style. Each Ignite-style talk will feature 15 slides that advance automatically every 20 seconds. Although there will be no time scheduled between individual presentations for questions and answers, the remainder of the session time will be used for extended questions and discussion.

The theme of this Ignite session is 'Future Innovative Scholarship'. We would like you to use the ignite format to showcase your idea/s for your next scholarship projects. What would you research, create or innovate to improve teaching and learning in the OU STEM Faculty? This is the time to get creative, blue skies thinking and money no object!

The Q and A discussion phase of this session will help support your future project scoping and planning and ensure your good ideas become reality.

Workshops/demonstrations (Abstract 250 – 500 words)

Workshop/demonstration sessions are up to 1 hour. Demonstrations must provide participants with a simulated student/tutor experience, e.g. using new e-learning tools or devices, immersive environments, etc. You might want to allow time for debriefing with participants in order to discuss their experience of the simulated activity.

Abstracts should provide a brief description of the activity/session.

Guidelines for abstract submissions

Please use the online abstract submission form which can be found at <http://www3.open.ac.uk/forms/esteemconf2020abstractsubmission>. Please submit separate submissions for each session being proposed.

Each abstract submitted should be an accurate summary of the planned presentation/session. All accepted abstracts will be published in the conference booklet.

The deadline for submissions is **Friday 14 February 2019**.

Posters will be displayed on poster boards and printed to A1 size. Posters may be accompanied by handouts/supplementary materials.

Short oral presentations will be in groups of 3/4. PC and projection facilities will be provided.

The Ignite session will consist of between 5-8 presentations; each talk will feature 15 slides that advance automatically every 20 seconds. PC and projection facilities will be provided

Author(s) of the **workshop/demonstration** sessions are to specify on the abstract submission form if they have any special equipment/room requirements beyond a PC and projection facilities and we will try our best to accommodate you.
