



eSTEeM Student Reference Panel

The eSTEeM student reference panel will comprise of up to 6 STEM UG/PG students (ideally one from each STEM school) and members of the eSTEeM Management Team (Director, Deputy Director, Senior Manager, Scholarship and Centre Support Assistant). It may also include up to 2 co-opted student representatives from OUSA, 1 staff and 1 OUSA delegate from another OU Scholarship and Innovation Centre. The panel has the right to extend membership as required.

Role Description

- Serve on the eSTEeM (STEM Scholarship and Innovation Centre) Student Reference Panel for a period of 2 years. This term may be extended by a further year after consultation between the panel member and eSTEeM Management Team.
- 2. Engage with the STEM scholarship agenda via eSTEeM and seek to inform students at large on the nature of OU STEM Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (SoTL), its purpose and scope.
- 3. Contribute to student and faculty facing discussions about STEM scholarship priorities.
- 4. Ensure student views on scholarship priorities for the faculty are fully represented to eSTEeM/OU STEM Faculty.
- 5. Support eSTEeM in the dissemination of the outputs of scholarship projects to the STEM student body.
- 6. With eSTEeM, explore routes/structures by which students can cocollaborate on specific scholarship projects, providing expertise and guidance to project teams.
- 7. You must be currently studying or have completed studies on a STEM qualification at undergraduate level 2 or 3 in the last 12 months. We also welcome STEM postgraduate students.

Duties

1. Attend up to 3 meetings (virtually or f2f) per year of the Student Reference Panel, ahead of each project call. Attendance to additional meetings may be required.

- 2. Use the 'eSTEeM and Co' website on a regular basis to share scholarly outputs, seek feedback and engagement with the scholarship agenda with other STEM students.
- 3. Attend virtually and promote to students a range of online events which showcase and disseminate scholarly outputs of specific interest to students, potentially a maximum of 2 events per year.
- 4. Attend and participate in the annual eSTEeM conference.
