### What do I need to bring?

#### All students (including OU staff members)

- A laptop/tablet unless your funder is providing one
- Original Degree certificate(s), including certified translation if not in English or Welsh
- Proof of identity, which must be one of:
  - 1. Current passport or national identity card
  - 2. Current UK or EEA driver's license
  - 3. HM Armed Forces identity card
- Proof of nationality, which must be one of:
  - 1. Current passport or national identity card
  - 2. UK birth/adoption certificate
  - 3. UK Home Office naturalisation/registration certificate

#### Non-UK students

- Biometric residence permit (BRP) or current share code
- Proof of English language proficiency as supplied with your application. This will be one of:
  - 1. IELTS certificate
  - 2. Degree certificate from a majority English-speaking country
  - 3. Proof of nationality of a majority English-speaking country
- Student route visa holders: Home office letter confirming your visa
- Student route visa holders: Proof of the date you entered the UK (e.g. boarding pass, flight confirmation)

All documents **MUST** be originals. You will **NOT** be registered for your degree until you have provided all required documentation.
