



Assessment of public learning opportunities 2023–24

1. OpenLearn

The vast majority of The Open University's public learning opportunities take the form of free courses and resources on our OpenLearn platform. These are developed by OU faculties and are part of the university's mission to open up education to more people. The courses can be studied by people at their own pace, and the choice of study is continually expanding. Learners vary from professionals looking to upskill, to people studying in the leisure time for personal enjoyment, to people getting their first taste of adult learning which may then lead the way to more formal study.

Until 2019-20, courses developed by the OU in Wales historically hosted on OpenLearn Create, a separate informal platform designed for external users to create their own courses. We took a decision to phase out the use of OpenLearn Create as it was less optimised for search engines. Instead, two new hubs – OpenLearn Cymru and OpenLearn Wales were created on the OU OpenLearn site to catalogue all free learning content which was either developed by the OU in Wales, is popular in Wales, of Welsh interest and/or available in Welsh.

Table 1 provides an outline of how Welsh users can interact with the site in Welsh, and which courses and resources are available in Welsh following an assessment by the OU in Wales.

We made a request in 2022 for the ability to provide a prominent sidebar link to the Welsh version of a resource if available. This has been implemented for any resources published after April 2022 and for any older resources updated after April 2022.

Other resources that have been developed centrally by The OU may not be available in Welsh but are included as they are of interest to people in Wales. 2. OpenTalks

The Open University in Wales has planned five OpenTalks for 2023-24, which will be available as online videos.

They will be filmed in February-April 2024, and released in May-June 2024 on a bespoke YouTube channel.

Academics featured in the films will be given the choice to use Welsh. Transcripts for the films will be made available in Welsh. The films themselves will feature examples or anecdotes relevant to Wales and the Welsh language to support research messages where possible.

3. In-person public learning opportunities

To assess if an in-person public learning opportunity should be made available in Welsh, the OU has created an internal tool for staff to score the project. Opportunities are scored out of 8 based on:

- the content of the learning opportunity suggesting it should offered be in Welsh (2)
- funding arrangements suggesting it should be offered in Welsh (4)
- the target group/participants/audience likely expectation that it should be offered in Welsh. (2)

Opportunities with a score of 4 or higher will be delivered in Welsh. Opportunities with a score lower than 4 may still have some aspect of the delivery in Welsh.

The in-person public learning opportunities for 2023-24 are listed in table 2.
